# **REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS**

## **ETIQUETTE**

Members are urged to observe the etiquette of the game and to ensure the enjoyment of golf for all Members and visitors.

- No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- The player who has the honor should be allowed to play before his opponent or fellow competitor tees the ball.
- Do not play a stroke until the players in front have moved out of range.
- In the interests of all, players should walk briskly between shots and play without delay.
- Players searching for a ball should allow other players coming up to pass them they should signal to the players following them to pass, and should not continue their play until those players have moved out of range.
- Players losing more than one whole fairway should give way to the following players.
- Through the green a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced by him is replaced at once and pressed down, and that all ball marks, or other damage to the Putting Green, caused by the player, is carefully repaired by him.
- Players should ensure that no damage is done to the Putting Green by dropping clubs or the flag-stick, or any other thing, and that neither they nor their caddies damage the hole by standing close to the hole or in handling of the flag-stick. The flag-stick should be properly replaced in the hole before the players leave the putting green.
- All trundlers must be kept clear of greens, tees and wet patches, and should be kept to the outer side of bunkers.
- Only a maximum of two balls can be used on the course at one time when practicing.
- PLEASE RAKE BUNKERS AFTER PLAYING A STROKE FROM THEM, and leave the rakes INSIDE the bunkers.

## **HANDICAPS**

The method of handicapping shall be as laid down by the New Zealand Golf Association in the Handicapping and Course Rating Handbook in their current Year Book. Members should acquaint themselves with their current course handicap before commencing play. The committee expects a scorecard to be returned for every Stipulated Round played.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERY PLAYER TO ENSURE THAT HIS / HER SCORECARD IS CORRECTLY AND CLEARLY FILLED IN, SIGNED AND ATTESTED, AND HANDED TO THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR CHECKING CARDS FOR THAT DAYS PLAY, OR PLACED IN THE BOX PROVIDED.

ALL MATCH PLAY CARDS WILL BE HANDED IN FOR HANDICAPPING AS STIPULATED BY NZGA

## REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS

#### STARTING TIMES

Starting time means on the TEE.

Players must report to the Starter immediately they arrive at the course and are requested to be ready to play 10 minutes before scheduled starting time in case of cancellations. The starter, at his discretion, may make up groups in order to maximize course utilization and to maintain the smooth flowing of the field. Players are to co-operate in this respect. If it is necessary to cancel or amend your starting time it is common courtesy to notify the Club. Penalties are provided for in the Rules of Golf (Rule 5.3) for failure to start on time.

Only the Starter may adjust start times or tee's if required.

#### **DISPUTES AND PROTESTS**

Any dispute or protest concerning any competition or match must be made in writing immediately upon the completion of such competition or match, and such dispute or protest will be dealt with as soon as possible by the Match Committee of the day.

#### **DRESS**

Members and their visitors are requested to maintain a reasonable standard of dress and footwear both on the course and in the Clubhouse. Beach or athletic shorts and singlets are not acceptable. No golf shoes are to be worn upstairs in club-house.

#### **GREEN FEES**

Green Fees must be paid by anyone other than a member for every 18 holes or part thereof. A Green Fee receipt/ tag must be in the possession of visitors and shown when requested to do so for inspection.

## BAR LOUNGE AND CLUBHOUSE HOURS

The Bar hours are displayed on the Notice Board and elsewhere in the Clubhouse. These hours may be varied at the discretion of the Board and in accordance with the Club's license. The Bar Manager has the right to refuse service to any person if, in their opinion, that person's behavior is not acceptable.

The Bar Manager is responsible to ensure that Bar opening and closing hours are observed. Please return empty glasses, bottles and jugs to the Bar.

## **CHILDREN**

Children under the age of 10 years, other than Junior Members, must be fully supervised on the course by a parent or guardian at all times.

Children are not permitted in the Clubhouse unless under the control of their parent or guardian.

## **CAR PARKING**

In consideration of others, Members are requested to park their cars carefully and in such a manner as to ensure that the greatest number of cars can be accommodated. Please observe those places reserved for Executive Members. Security and insurance of members vehicles parked in the Club carpark is entirely at the owners risk and cost.

# **REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS**

## **GOLF BAG/TRUNDLER SHEDS**

Only those members who have rented golf bag/ trundler space may use the Trundler Sheds. Please ensure you respect the stored property of other players in these areas and keep your items

within the space allocated to you.

IN THE INTERESTS OF SECURITY, THE STORAGE AREA DOOR MUST BE LOCKED AFTER USE.

## **COURSE AND CLUBHOUSE TIDINESS**

The Board requests that Members assist in maintaining tidiness. Please use the receptacles on the Course. Ensure that golf shoes and other equipment are clean and free from grass and mud before entering the Locker Room areas.

YOUR CO-OPERATION IS APPRECIATED.

#### **CLUB STAFF**

No employee of the Club shall be directly reprimanded by an individual member at any time. Greens staff have priority on the course for maintenance purposes.

## SUGGESTIONS AND COMPLAINTS

Suggestions are welcomed and should be made in writing to the Club President or General Manager for consideration.

All complaints in respect to the Warkworth Golf Club shall be made in writing signed by the complainants and delivered to the Secretary. After consideration by the Board the Club will reply in writing.

## **MEMBERS RIGHTS**

Members have the right to ensure that the Clubs Regulations and By-Laws are observed, especially by visitors and Green Fee players. To this extent any member has the right to speak directly to any person seen to be in breach of the Rules, in particular concerning misconduct and damage to the Course, and including trespass. Any incident must be reported immediately to the Board.

#### MOTORISED TRANSPORT

The Board recognizes that the use of motorized transport can extend the playing life of a golfer. Such vehicles are permitted on the course, providing they meet specifications regarding noise levels, emissions and tyre widths. Security and insurance is entirely at the owner's risk and cost.

## **CLUB TROPHIES AND CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION**

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Only full playing WWGC members with live handicaps are eligible for entry to Club competitions.

## MATCH PLAY

In all Match play events conducted under Handicap conditions, strokes will be taken by a player/side where they fall on the Stroke Index Table on the scorecard.

ALL MATCHES MUST BE PLAYED AT THE TIME SHOWN ON THE STARTING SHEET OR ON OR BEFORE THE DATE SET DOWN IN THE PROGRAMME BOOK EXCEPT IN EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES BY ARRANGEMENT WITH THE MATCH COMMITTEE.

Before entering any competition to be played over several rounds, players must ensure that they are available for all rounds on the dates set down. If not, they must not enter as defaulting matches is unfair to other players who might otherwise have qualified.

Any match 'all square' after the stipulated number of holes will be resolved by 'sudden death' playoff from No1 tee (or as posted) taking strokes as per the Stroke Table Index if a handicap event.
Players defaulting from the first round of a Match play event will not be eligible for the Flights of
that event.

Official starting tees for Match Play; No1 and No 10.

#### STROKE PLAY

Ties in stroke play competitions will be decided by count back as per the NZGA handbook with the exception that the haggle may be decided by lot (Championship ties may be decided by play-off).

# **HANDICAPS**

In any Handicap Competition, the player's COURSE handicap posted on the day on which the Competition is played shall be the handicap on which the player competes.

## **REFEREES**

The Match Committees may appoint referees for any competitions at their discretion. Referees on course decisions shall be final.

# **REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS**

MOTORISED TRANSPORT See also Club Regulations.

The use of motorized carts and motor bikes is permitted in Club Competitions with the exception of Club Championships when motorized assistance (apart from battery powered trundlers) will not be permitted.

Motorized Transport may be used in the Club Championship if a Medical Exemption is granted by the Match Committee.

Applications for a Medical Exemption must be in writing, and the application must be accompanied by a Doctor's certificate or similar.

Medical Exemptions are valid only for the duration of the Club Championships for which they are applied for. Medical Exemptions are at the sole discretion of the Match Committee.
